The Royal Canadian Mint in Ottawa produces handcrafted collector and commemorative coins, gold bullion coins, medals and medallions. This is where the master tooling is done to create the dies that strike coin designs for both commemorative and circulation issues. The Mint's gold refining and advanced engineering operations are also located here. The guided 45 min. tour costs \$5 for seniors (65+) & \$6 for adults.
